ReSTART Kits

ReSTART, which stands for **Surviving Today and ReSTARTing Tomorrow**, is a project that was developed and started in 2004.

Soroptimist international of White Rock provides kits of new household items (kitchen, bedding, toiletries etc.) for women and children that are leaving transition houses to live independently free from violence and abuse.

Our research showed that women and children arrive at transition houses, often through police intervention or from the hospital emergency ward, with few or no personal belongings. We determined that basic household necessities are crucial for women and children trying to start independent living.
